For each photo please provide the subject, date, & location. For each item of artwork, please identify the artist, medium, subject, and year created.

The purposes of the Wildlife Learning Exchange are to:

1. Create an educational web site where children and others can find information about wild animals of North America.
2. Publicize the importance of preserving natural lands as wildlife habitat.
3. Benefit wildlife photographers, artists, and sound recordists by publishing their work in a context that maximizes its educational value and increases its visibility.
